The Pacific Odd Fellow for May, 1897, included a feature article, "Oregon Early Lodge History," which recounted the story of Odd Fellowship in Oregon. Earliest efforts to establish a lodge here began in 1846, when a Past Grand Master of Washington D.C. and lodge brothers from St. Louis, separately applied for power to institute a lodge in Oregon. Both applications were turned down.

Brother Gilbert Wastson, P.G. of Mass. also applied in 1846 for a dispensation to establish a lodge in Oregon City on his arrival there. He represented the 5 Odd Fellows were in a party about to start for Oregon and received a dispensation from the D.D. Grand Sire of Mass. to establish Oregon Lodge No. 1. The Grand Lodge of the U.S. (now the Sovereign Grand Lodge) legalized the action and provided a charter to replace the one given by The party from Mass. set sail in April, 1846, down Mass. the Atlantic coast, around Cape Horn and up the Pacific but finally found anchorage not somewhere in Oregon, rather in Honolulu, Sandwich Islands. The charter was than used to establish Excelsior Lodge No. 1 in Honolulu, thousand miles from Oregon.

The Odd Fellows of Portland, early in 1851, made application to Special Deputy Grand Sire Frazer for a warrant and books for opening a lodge in Portland, but they were never received, although sent by Brother Frazer. In Jan. 1851, Brother E.M. Barnum and 5 other Brothers living in Salem sent a petition to the G.L.U.S. for establishment of a lodge in Salem. A warrant was issued for "Chemeketa Lodge No. 1" in August, 1852, and Barnum was commissioned to open the lodge, as Special Deputy Grand Sire. Chemeketa Lodge No. 1 was instituted in Salem on Dec. 6, 1852. The name of the lodge was selected from the former names of the site of Salem, Chemeketa Prairie, Chemeketa being an Indian word for "the old home" or "the old camp". This was the first Odd Fellow lodge north of California on the Pacific Coast.

Additional lodges were soon instituted, including Samaritan No. 2, Portland and Oregon No. 3, Oregon City, both in 1853. Albany No. 4 in Albany, in 1854 Columbia No. 5 in The Dalles. Brother Barnum was among those instrumental in establishing many of the preceding lodges, and had the honor in 1858 of instituting Barnum Lodge No. 7, Corvallis, named for him.

The four lodges in existence in 1856 received approval to establish the Right Worthy Grand Lodge of the Territory of Oregon.

Special round trip tickets good for special trains will be on sale at Laue's drug store, 3rd and Yamhill, and at Heath's drug store, Williams Avenue and Russell Streets, Albina, and by the conductor on the motor.

It is requested that all who attend purchase tickets before taking the car as the committee had to guarantee a certain number in order to secure the special cars.

Albina cars connecting with motor going to Portsmouth leave Fourth and Yamhill Streets at 5:10;6:05 and 7:20 o'clock, P.M.

All Odd Fellow are cordially invited to be present and aid in making the institution of this new lodge a grand success.
